Articles of Association.

Article I.

41 Know All Men By These Presents That we, the undersigned, James Benice,
42 John G. Lonsdale, S. C. Buckingham, Daniel F. Taylor, Joseph M. O'Reilly,
43 Joseph O'Neil and Durcan Joy under and pursuant to the provisions of
44 Article X of Chapter 33 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri of the year 1909,
45 and the laws of said state, hereby associate and constitute ourselves, our
46 associates and successors as a body corporate and politic in the name of
47 Missouri Aeronautical Society.

Article II.

48 The location of the Society will be in the City of St. Louis Missouri.

Article III.

50 The Society will continue for a period of fifty (50) years, subject to

renewal or extension as may be provided by law,

Article IV.

It is the purpose of this Society to develop, promote and teach the science and practice of aeronautics and aviation; to teach, equip and instruct pilots and operators of all air craft in the construction, repair and operation of the same; to buy, maintain, lease, sell, or in any manner acquire, own, encumber or dispose of such real or personal property as may be necessary to the achievement of such purposes.

Provided that any money or other property received by this Society, whether by donation or otherwise, shall be devoted solely to the purposes above set forth and not to pecuniary profit of any of its members, nor shall any money or other property of the Society be paid or conveyed to any person except as compensation for property purchased or services actually rendered.

Article V.

The officers of the Society shall be a President, Treasurer and Secretary, and four Directors. The duties of the officers shall be defined by the By-Laws. The officers shall be elected at the annual meetings of the Society, which shall be held on the first Monday in June of each year. The following have been selected to serve until the first Monday in June, 1918, or until their successors are elected and qualify.

Article VI.

The Society shall have power to collect from its members such initiation fee as its By-Laws shall provide, and annual dues from its members not to exceed the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00), unless by a majority vote of the members present at any regular or special meeting an increase in the amount of such dues be sanctioned.

Provisions for the addition of members to the Society, for their qualifications and for the removal of officers for cause, shall be made by the By-Laws.

Article VII.

Amendments to these articles, subject to the provisions of the law governing the same may be made by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Society present at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for such purpose.

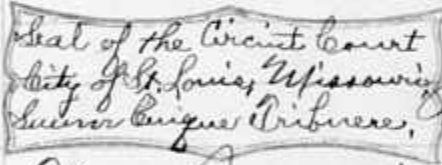
